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English

In English, the children we will be using 'FArTHER' by Grahame Baker-Smith as the inspiration for our lessons. During these lessons, children will have a go at writing sequel stories, recounts (postcards), setting descriptions, diary entries and instructions. We have grammar, handwriting and spelling sessions within the week too. In all areas of the curriculum, we will be practising using a legible, joined handwriting style.

In reading, we will be reading "The Wild Robot" by Peter Brown and "There's a Rang-Tan in my bedroom" by James Selleick. Within these Whole Class Reading sessions, children will learn many different reading skills to help support their own development. In Story Time, we will be reading "You're a Bad Man, Mr Gum!" By Andy Stanton.

Geography: Earning a living

In Geography, our topic is all about how people in the UK earn a living. We will find out about the different types of industries in the UK and in the wider world. After this, we will learn about how children around the world earn a living for their families. During this topic, we will develop our use of an atlas to locate places in the UK and in the wider world.

Mathematics



In Mathematics, we will learn how to multiply and divide by 6, 7, 9, 11 and 12. The children will learn how to calculate multiplication equations using the multiplication facts that they know and to understand the difference between sharing and grouping. We will then, solve problems involving multiplication and division. Later, the children will use their tables and knowledge of place value to multiply multiples of 10 and 100, leading to the multiplication of 3-digit numbers using short multiplication. Finally, we will learn more about division and will divide 2-digit numbers using two methods, including numbers with remainders.

We will continue to play TTRS in preparation for the multiplication check. We would appreciate it if you encouraged your child to play at home too.

Science: The Digestive System

In Science, we will learn about the human digestive system and how it works.

We will name and describe each part and its role in digestion. Our scientific enquiry focus will be research; we will work as scientists to find out information about how the body works.

DT: Mechanisms

In DT this half term we will be making our own pop-up book in which the children will create their own mechanism. We will begin by looking at ready-made pop-up books and what they contain, before planning and making our own based on either the Ancient Greeks or the Egyptians.

PE

In PE, we will continue with our weekly swimming sessions on a **Wednesday**. We have been really impressed with the children's water confidence and are now moving on to focusing more on stroke style.

In school, our topic is gymnastics. We will be building on the skills the children learnt last year. The children will learn a range of jumps and balances. Finally, they will create their own sequence on the floor and on apparatus. This term, some of the words that we will be learning in Year 4 include:

RE



For the first few weeks, our topic is 'Called', where we learn about what it is like to be called by God and about Confirmation.

As we get closer to Christmas, the topic of 'Gifts' will begin. We will learn about the annunciation, visitation, the nativity, visit of the shepherds and the wise men.

Throughout all the units, we will explore scripture and think about what it means to us.

We will continue with our class Liturgical Prayer, which is planned by the children.

PSHE

In our Mission Circles/Circle Time, we will be exploring the following themes: Justice, Holiness, Change, Remembrance, Youth, Kingdom, Hope, Peace and Joy. The children will discuss each key concept and reflect on how it relates to their own lives. Alongside this, we will also mark Anti-Bullying Week, Black History Month and learn about democracy.

Latin/Computing

In Latin, the children will complete their final unit of the year: 'Work, Work, Work'. In this, they will be finding out about the lives of slaves in Roman times and relate the story of Pandora's box to what is happening in the world today. In Computing, the children will begin by completing a unit on Online Safety, where we will be learning about how to keep ourselves safe from viruses. After this, we will begin our second unit called 'Animation', where we will animate an object.
