Year 2 are learning about;

English

In English, our new unit will be based around the book 'The Bear Under the Stairs' by Helen Cooper. In this unit, the children discuss their fears and how they deal with them. They will write letters of advice to the main character before writing their own story of a child who fears something that might be in the house. The sequence of learning finishes with children making comparisons between real bears and toy bears and using this as the basis for an information report about bears to give to William to help him feel less scared. We will then begin our new unit based around the book, 'The Bear and the Piano' by David Litchfield. They will write statements as predictions before going on to use contracted verbs to write letters of advice. We will then continue this unit after half term. We will continue to have our daily Little Wandle spelling and phonics lessons and Guided Reading three times a week. This term we will be reading 'The Legend of Kevin' by Philip Reeve & Ms Sarah McIntyre.

History: Florence Nightengale

This half term in History, children will find out who Florence Nightingale was and when she lived. They will explore traditional expectations for women at this time and how Florence rejected these in favour of becoming a nurse. They will learn facts about her life and think about their own ambitions for when they grow up.

Maths


In Mathematics, we will be learning about 3-D shapes (cube, prism, pyramid, cuboid, sphere, and cylinder) and the types of faces and surfaces they have. Do they have a flat face or a curved surface? We will look at the number of faces and children will identify 2-D shapes on the surface of 3-D shapes. We will then learn about fractions including recognising, finding, naming, and writing fractions (1/3, 1/4, 2/4 and 3/4) of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity. Children will also write simple fractions e.g., 1/2 of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of 2/4 and 1/2. We will also be learning to tell the time. We will be revising o'clock and half past before moving on to quarter past. We will continue to practise recalling our 2-, 5- and 10-times tables so that we know the answers off-by-heart. We will also continue our Mastering Number programme to strengthen our knowledge of number and calculation.

Science

In Science, children will explore and compare the differences between things that are living, things that are dead, and things that have never been alive. They will identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.

We then move onto our unit called 'Thanksgiving', where we look at the Eucharist and parts of the Mass. As part of this unit, we will retell the story of the Last Supper.

Music



Year 2 have started their new Music unit 'Friendship Song.' Each lesson will consist of fun warm-up games. Children will listen to and appraise different songs linked to the theme of friendship. They will then practise compositions that they have created themselves and work towards a final performance.
