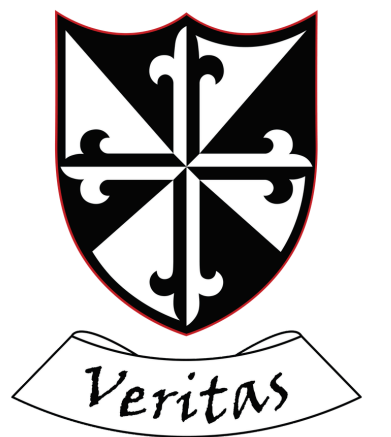


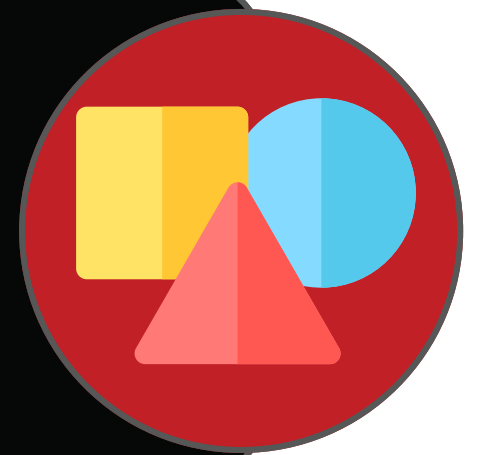

Mathematics

This half term in maths we will be recapping previous learning. We will look at comparing numbers and know which is more/less than, continue to develop our understanding of counting beyond 20 and the patterns when counting, look at the composition of numbers and doubles of numbers and that numbers can be odd and even.



English

This term we will start by writing about what rules we would create if we were a king or a queen and write what we love about our grandparents. Finally we will look at the rhyming book 'Oi Frog' before learning and writing our own sentences from the book.



Religious Education

Our final topic this year is 'Dialogue and Encounter' branch. During this topic we will learn that there are many faiths around the world which we need to respect, that Jesus was Jewish and celebrated many Jewish festivals. That Jesus had special friends and two of Jesus' friends were Saint Peter and Saint Paul.



Understanding the World

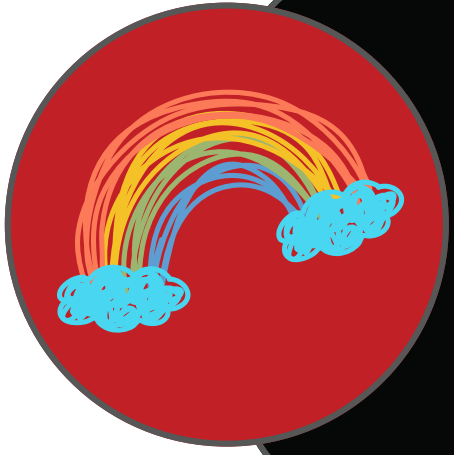
This term, we will look at geographical landmarks in London and England and talk about if we have ever seen these in person. We will learning about the season, summer, and about floating and sinking before finally looking at minibeasts and their habitats.



Physical Development

In PE this half term, we will be looking at hitting, throwing and catching. We will start with balloons and beagbags before moving onto soft balls. Finally we will try out some contact games using balls such as dodgeball.





Expressive Arts & Design

We will continue to use a range of material to create our own designs but we will begin to think about how we could improve these designs next time and develop our design process. We will look at using music to create different movements and have a go at creating our own musical instrument.

Personal Development

This term we will look at respect and what that means and how we can show respect to others. We will learn about voting and having a fair choice as well as why we have rules in our homes, schools and communities and why we need them. Finally we will look at conflict resolution and how we can learn to accept responsibility and say sorry to others.
